### Christianity, Islam and the Values of the Market Economy

Born in 1959. Dieter Thomä studied philosophy and literature at the Universities of Freiburg and Berlin. Between 1982 and 1983, he attended the Henri Nannen School of Journalism in Hamburg. Dieter Thomä received his Ph.D. from Freiburg University in 1989 and the postdoctoral qualification from Rostock University in 1997.

During his studies, he acted as editor of *Sender Freies Berlin* from 1983 to 1984. Dieter Thomä lectured on philosophy at universities in Paderborn, Rostock, Essen, Berlin and New York. Furthermore, he was a fellow of the *Alexander von Humboldt* Foundation in New York from 1997 to 1999 and a senior scholar at the Getty Research Institute in Los Angeles between 2002 and 2003. He was Dean of the Humanities School from 2002 to 2005. Since 2000, he has been Professor of philosophy at the University of St. Gallen.

In 1996, Dieter Thomä received a prize for essay writing at the International *Joseph Roth* Journalism Contest.

He has published several books as well as numerous articles in scholarly journals, newspapers and magazines.
