Born in 1948. Hidetoshi Fujisawa graduated with a Bachelor in political science from Waseda University in Tokyo in 1973. He also studied in the United States as a Great College Association (GCA) exchange student at Denison University, Ohio.

Hidetoshi Fujisawa entered NHK Japan Broadcasting Corporation as a news reporter in 1973, covering civil, political and economic news. In 1982, he was appointed Bureau Chief in Hong Kong. After serving briefly as Los Angeles Bureau Chief, he worked as correspondent at the Washington bureau, where he covered President Reagan's re-election campaign and his second term. From 1991 until 1995, Hidetoshi Fujisawa also served as Washington Bureau Chief for NHK and reported on U.S. politics and foreign policy.

From 1995 until recently, Hidetoshi Fujisawa anchored NHK Evening News and BS23 World News. He currently serves as Executive Correspondent for NHK News, supervising news and documentary programmes.
