John Fund studied journalism and economics at California State University.

He worked as a research analyst for the California State legislature in Sacramento before beginning his journalism career in 1982 as a reporter for the syndicated columnists Rowland Evans and Robert Novak. He became an editorial page writer specialising in politics and government in 1986 and was named a member of the Journal's editorial board in 1995. He is currently on leave as a member of the editorial board of The Wall Street Journal writing a book on American election law in the aftermath of the contested 2000 presidential election.

John Fund is a frequent contributor to the MSNBC and CNBC cable news channels, where he appears as a commentator. He received the Warren Brookes Award for journalistic excellence from the American Legislative Exchange Council in 1993.
