

Prof. Dr. Kuniko Inoguchi (JP)
Professor of Political Science, Faculty of Law

Born in 1952. Kuniko Inoguchi graduated with a Bachelor of Arts from Sophia University in Tokyo in 1975 and with a Master from Yale University in 1977. She also holds a Ph.D. which she earned from Yale University in 1982.

Kuniko Inoguchi started her academic career as Associate Professor at the Faculty of Law at Sophia University where she lectured from 1981 to 1990. Between 1983 and 1990, she was a Visiting Fellow at the Center for International Affairs at Harvard University. In 1986, Kuniko Inoguchi acted as Visiting Professor at the Department of Political Science at the Australian National University. In 1990, she returned to Sophia University as Professor at the Faculty of Law, where she lectured until 2002. Subsequently, Kuniko Inoguchi was nominated Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the Conference on Disarmament, a position she held until 2004. Currently, she again lectures as Professor of Political Science at Sophia University.

Kuniko Inoguchi serves as an Executive Member of the Japan Association of International Relations as well as of the Japan Association of Gaming and Simulation. She was a Member of the Prime Minister's Defense Policy Review Council from 1994 to 1995 and a Member of the Prime Minister's Administrative Reform Council from 1996 to 1998. In 1997, Kuniko Inoguchi joined the ITER Project as a Member of the Special Committee where she served until 2002. From 2001 until 2002, she additionally served as a Member of the Prime Minister's Gender Equality Council.

Occasionally, Kuniko Inoguchi lectures at civil service training institutions and comments on Japan's foreign policy and international affairs for newspapers and she has published widely.
